There were 6 in the family & children were & Dead
Jackie was 17 months younger than me, so we were close, his friends & my friends were Maths, couldn't be closer. We grew up in Fairfield went to St Anthony's School. He drummed us into school after Recs, so you can see, we just naturally called him the Drummer Boy. He finished up Drummer on the H.M.A.S. Adelaide. Jack joined the Navy, did his training Port Melbourne, then onto H.M.A.S. Adelaide, His Birthday (21st) was to be held at Home on 13th August 1941 but they over (100 Boys) were being transferred from Adelaide H.Q.R.S. to H.M.A.S. Sydney between Aug & Sept. so we kept his Birthday over till Sept. Only 4 men of his mates came to celebrate (so sad). They were all from H.M.A.S. Adelaide & as my brother said not one transferring onto the chief H.C. big one, so broad, two words, We lost him whilst on the way home from the Convoy. I am alone now, I've lost them all, but I will let them know about the good people who found the H.M.A.S. Sydney. I will be going with Melbourne Shrine 19 December but nowhere else as my limbs are 89 years old & letting all know. Thank you all, respectfully Mrs. E. A. S.
