Information given to me by My Mother  
Mary Agness Glossop (Nee Burnsyde)

The first news of William Burnsyde  
was a telegrame sent to my Grandfather  
Rufas Burnsyde @ Kudardup (Near  
Augusta, south west Australia)

stated that the Navy regretted to inform  
that William was lost.

My mother sent her younger brother  
Joseph Burnsyde, #MAS PERTH, a  
telegrame saying Bill was lost.

The captain gave this telegrame to Joe  
Burnsyde and asked what he thought  
it meant. Joe replied if Bill is lost  
then so is the SYDNEY.

A TELEGRAME LATER RECIEVD by my Grand-  
father Rufas, STATED WILLIAM Had become  
a first class STOKER. BILL never got this  
News. He would have been so proud  
to hear this News.

AN ORIGINAL TALLY BAND with ~~#~~ SYDNEY  
Belonging to William was one of two  
items I inherited from my Mother  
The second item is a NAVY Bed Quilt  
I am unsure if it is from HMAS SYDNEY  
~~OR~~ OR HMAS PERTH. Probably STANDARD  
ISSUE for the NAVY AT THAT TIME.

The Quilt WAS used BY my Mother and  
also my family and is well used.

William was the 2nd youngest child of  
Rufus Daniel Burnside + AGNES BURNSIDE  
(NEE) EASTCOTT, William + Joseph were  
the only SONS of 8 children BORN TO THIS  
Family who resided in the South West  
of WESTERN AUSTRALIA.
